Our campus includes a schoolhouse, dormitories, clinical and vocational building, historic sea captain's home with reception, dining room, nursing wing, classrooms, and offices. We're located close to parks, bayside beaches, the National Seashore, and other Cape Cod treasures.

Our intensive therapeutic residential school serves children with intellectual disabilities. Founded in 1970, Latham Centers' mission is to help children and adults with complex special needs, including Prader-Willi syndrome, to lead meaningful, abundant lives.
